Scripture

Since this week is the week of the National Day of Prayer (Thursday, May 7) let us focus our Scripture reflections on what the Bible says about repentance.

Reflections on Repentance:

Acts 3:19

Repent therefore, and turn back, that your sins may be blotted out, 20 that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord.

Romans 2:4-5

⁴ Do you presume on the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance? ⁵ But because of your hard and impenitent heart you are storing up wrath for yourself on the day of wrath when God's righteous judgment will be revealed.

II Corinthians 7:10

For godly grief produces a repentance that leads to salvation without regret, whereas worldly grief produces death.

Hebrews 12:5-7

⁵ "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him. ⁶ For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives." ⁷ It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons.

I Peter 1:14-16

¹⁴ As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, ¹⁵ but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, ¹⁶ since it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy."

II Peter 3:9

The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance.

I John 1:8-9

⁸ If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁹ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Prayer

II Chronicles 7:14 If my people, who are called by my Name, will humble themselves and pray.

There are seven Psalms that are called Penitential Psalms or Psalms of repentance. We will use three of them this week to guide our prayers for repentance for ourselves, our families, our church, and our nation.

Psalm 38:1-11, 17-22

- ¹ O Lord, rebuke me not in your anger, nor discipline me in your wrath!
- ² For your arrows have sunk into me, and your hand has come down on me.
- ³ There is no soundness in my flesh because of your indignation;
- there is no health in my bones because of my sin.
- ⁴ For my iniquities have gone over my head;
 - like a heavy burden, they are too heavy for me.
- ⁵ My wounds stink and fester

because of my foolishness,

- ⁶ I am utterly bowed down and prostrate;
 - all the day I go about mourning.
- ⁷ For my sides are filled with burning, and there is no soundness in my flesh.
- ⁸ I am feeble and crushed;

I groan because of the tumult of my heart.

- ⁹ O Lord, all my longing is before you; my sighing is not hidden from you.
- ¹⁰ My heart throbs; my strength fails me,
 - and the light of my eyes—it also has gone from me.
- ¹¹ My friends and companions stand aloof from my plague, and my nearest kin stand far off.
- ¹⁷ For I am ready to fall,

and my pain is ever before me.

¹⁸ I confess my iniquity;

I am sorry for my sin.

- ¹⁹ But my foes are vigorous, they are mighty, and many are those who hate me wrongfully.
- ²⁰ Those who render me evil for good accuse me because I follow after good.
- ²¹ Do not forsake me, O Lord!

O my God, be not far from me!

- ²² Make haste to help me,
 - O Lord, my salvation!
