I Chronicles 29:11-12

¹¹ Yours, O Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty, for all that is in the heavens and in the earth is yours. Yours is the kingdom, O Lord, and you are exalted as head above all.

¹² Both riches and honor come from you, and you rule over all. In your hand are power and might, and in your hand it is to make great and to give strength to all.

Prayer

II Chronicles 7:14 If my people, who are called by my Name, will humble themselves and pray.

Raise us from the dead, from the death of living for ourselves, from the death of our own small purposes, from the death of our pettiness. Raise us to newness of life in the power of your Spirit and in the power of your salvation and your Word. Transform us by the renewing of our minds.
